

The Break the Cycle Local Action Plan

How to set up our own Break the Cycle Task Group



1. Ensure that you invite BAME teaching and non-teaching staff who will represent views of our school and contribute to our strategy.

Recognise that you will also need to create a 'safe space' for BAME students, staff and parents to voice their personal views and experiences. This requires an open and honest environment where everyone can present, in order to ensure that the school can respond to their needs and concerns.

- 2. Find appropriate ways of feeding the input from your 'safe space' groups into your Break the Cycle Task Group

- 3. Using the Break the Cycle Manifesto as our ongoing guide to...

Meet regularly in a room where you can meet every two weeks.

Establish a clear purpose for the group.

Agree a vision for the school and the future.

Use the Break the Cycle Manifesto as a guide.

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Invite our staff and parents to join the group.

Make sure that our representatives are given the support they need.
